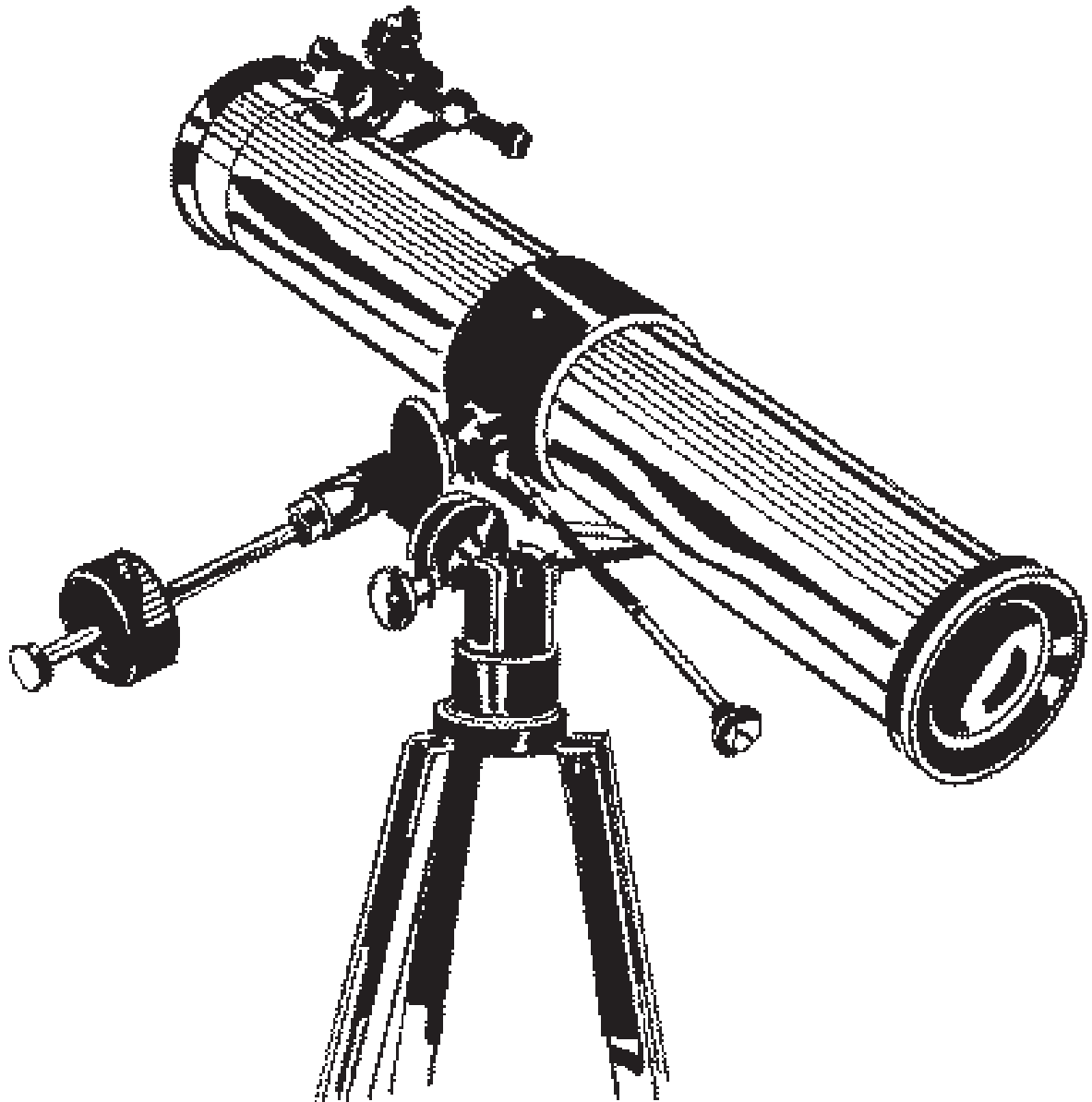

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Introduction

The fifth edition of the *Language 3* (copyright © 2018, Abeka) course covers the subject areas of grammar and creative writing. Before starting this course, instructors are encouraged to become familiar with the format of the workbook.

This answer key is provided by the staff of Christian Liberty Press to assist instructors in teaching this course. It includes the answers to the exercises in the student workbook and occasional teacher instructions. The phrase *Answers will vary* refers to exercises for which there are no explicit answers, although students must follow the directions found in the workbook. These are usually creative writing exercises. The phrase *Answers may vary* refers to exercises for which there are more than one possible answer. In most instances, we have attempted to provide possible answers to such exercises.

A brief mention must be made of the proofreading mark for “insert.” The workbook has the student making the insert mark below marks of punctuation, such as periods, commas, and quotation marks (\wedge). However, the normal convention is for periods and commas to appear below and inside the insert mark (\wedge). Insert marks for punctuation marks above the line normally would be above the letters, pointing downward, with the quotation mark or apostrophe within the angle (\sphericalangle). It is not necessary to possibly confuse the student by teaching both ways, but this explanation is offered in the event that you see the insert mark executed differently in other contexts.

The answer key should be used by instructors to review their students’ written work, and as an aid to help them guide students in answering their daily work questions if they have any problems.

If students have difficulty understanding concepts in the text, we suggest that instructors and students make use of the Glossary on pages 193-201 of the workbook. This helpful reference section contains rules and definitions that are taught in the text.

May God grant you wisdom and diligence as you seek to introduce the concepts of written communication to your students.

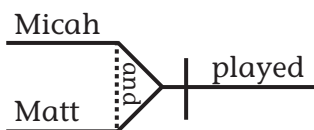
