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Introduction

The third edition of the *God's Gift of Language B* (copyright © 2009 by A Beka Book) course covers the subject areas of grammar and creative writing. The lesson format is one or two pages for each day of the school year. Before starting this course, instructors are encouraged to become familiar with the format of the workbook.

The answer key for this course is provided by the staff of Christian Liberty Press to assist instructors to successfully teach this course. It includes occasional teacher instructions in italic print and the answers to the exercises in the student workbook. The phrase *Answers will vary* refers to exercises where there are no explicit answers, although students must follow the directions found in the workbook and answer key. Frequently, these are creative writing activities. The phrase *Answers may vary* refers to situations where there are more than one possible answer. In most instances, we have attempted to provide possible answers to such exercises.

The answer key should be used by instructors to review their students' written work, and as an aid to help them guide students in answering their daily work questions if they have any problems. Students should not intentionally use the same wording in their answers as that found in the key, but should provide similar information.

May God grant you wisdom and diligence as you seek to introduce the concepts of written communication to your students.
